En route there he visited Involved's new gym in Lower Broughton, and danced around with its founder in the boxing ring. After lunch he blessed the shoeboxes that members of St Clement's, Lower Broughton were filling for needy children.



The afternoon was as busy as the morning: +David led a Bible study for the Salford clergy, then spoke at St John's, Pendlebury Tea Group, while being photographed by visiting members of St Philip's Camera Club. Salford's Mission Support Priest then drove +David round Media City, then accompanied him on a home visit to an elderly lady who was a longstanding member of the Cathedral.

The day ended in a 'Cheese and Beer' evening at Bishops court for Deanery Synod members and guests. After delicious refreshments the Bishop spoke about the events of the week and answered questions. The day that had begun at 9am now ended at 9pm. Then on Sunday the look-in on Salford that began at St Paul's, Kersal ended in St Andrew's, Carr Clough, after +David preached a memorable sermon at both churches on Proverbs 30 v28 – 'the wisdom of the lizard'.
